#### Our Doors Will Open for Worship!!

The Church Council recently had much discussion about opening our doors for inside worship service. The number one priority is, and always has been, the safety of our members. The information from Bishop Bard and the Michigan Conference of the United Methodist Church are still recommending churches follow the most recent executive order from our governor. That order includes a limit of indoor gatherings to 10 persons, but also points out that religious organizations are exempt from penalties.

Cooler weather will soon be here and continuing to worship outdoors is not very practical or appealing to most of us. Therefore, we have decided to open for worship on Sunday, September 13, 2020 and worship inside the sanctuary. Worship service begins at 9:30 a.m.

We are recommending you wear a mask and maintain 6-foot social distance when inside. Please refer to the updated Guidelines for Meeting Inside the Sanctuary. They are attached with this newsletter or on our website www.breckenridgeumc.org.

The last 6 months have been challenging for everyone. Our church family has been amazing during these difficult times with financial support. We hope you continue and your gifts and contributions are much appreciated. We will continue to record our worship services and share them on our website and Facebook page. Please watch them if you are unable to attend on Sunday and encourage your friends to check out our weekly services.

At this time, only the sanctuary and restrooms will be open. Please refrain from using the coat room and avoid congestion in that small area. The remainder of the church will still be closed on Sunday mornings and during the week. Please call the church if you need to stop by for any reason, and all visitors are asked to sign in when visiting during the week.

The Fellowship Hall will not be available for rental until November so we can have a chance to see how coming inside is working.



One of my favorite things to do when I am fearful is to sing... for some reason if I am singing, my mind concentrates on the words of the song, not on my worries, and I can let go of the concern, at least for some moments. I leave a Christian radio station playing in the house and in all the vehicles which keeps me grounded in praise and the Word of God.

One of my favorite songs from "The Faith We Sing" is the hymn: You Are Mine # 2218, by our Roman Catholic brother, David Haas. Haas plays on the words from Isaiah 43, Psalm 46 and John 14: "Do not be afraid, I am with you. I have called you each by name. Come and follow me, I will bring you home; I love you and you are mine." "

The verses to the song talk about God coming to us in the silence and lifting us from fear. The song says God is our hope, strength and freedom and will give us peace that the world cannot give. The words of Scripture and song bring to me the promises of God when I am fearful.

We certainly are living in and through fearful times. What do you do to bring peace to your soul? Some of you probably work in the garden or field. Maybe some of you cook, knit, go for walks, or find solace in woodworking or some other hobby. Maybe you can snuggle with a pet or grandchild. Sometimes I can find peace when cleaning—the vacuum does wonders to cancel out my worrisome thoughts!

These times of fear should be bringing us closer to God through prayer, worship, Bible study, singing and praying. This is a test of our real faith. Do we believe that our awesome God is in control or not? Do we believe that God has a plan even we can't fully understand it? Can we trust and praise God even in the time of the dark valley?

Did you know that there are approximately 365 phrases in Scripture that talk about not being afraid? One phrase for each day of the year---isn't that just like God to make sure we could find a verse each day if we wanted to? Some of the verses say: "Fear not," others: "Do not be afraid," and similar wording to bring us comfort.

Ruth Bell Graham wrote a book entitles: "Fear Not Tomorrow, God Is Already There." What a great title! What a great promise!! What a great thing for all of us to believe and practice in these worrisome times!!!

# Breckenridge United Methodist Church Guidelines for Meeting Inside the Sanctuary Updated: September 8, 2020

- There will only be one entrance door open. Please use the door next to the
  parking lot under the portico. Please don't come much earlier than 15 minutes
  prior to service, and upon entry into the church proceed to the sanctuary. Please
  refrain from using the coat room.
- In compliance with social distancing guidelines, please remain 6 feet apart from each other. The best time to socialize with friends is before or after worship service in the parking lot. There will not be any coffee hour. Other areas of the church will remain closed except for the restrooms.
- If you do not feel well, we ask that you please stay home.
- We encourage everyone that can wear a mask to please do so with the
  exception of children at the discretion of their parents. Please bring your mask
  from home or one will be provided for you. For anyone that is unable to wear a
  mask, there will be seating available in the narthex during the service. The
  greeters will have disinfectant spray for your hands, or there will be sanitizing gel
  available inside.
- We will follow recommendations and use every other row of pews. Please sit
  with your family, but keep 6-foot distance between other families or households
  in each row.
- Bulletins and attendance pads will not be passed out or used. Hymnals, Bibles, giving envelopes, pens, etc. will be removed from the pews.
- Offering plates will not be passed. Please leave your offering envelope in the plate at the back of the church. We encourage everyone to continue to give online or mail your tithes and offerings into the church office.
- There will not be any Children's time, Nursery or Children's Church. Teachers will provide packets with lessons and activity sheets to help occupy them during the worship service.
- After worship service, the ushers will excuse everyone by row in an orderly fashion. Please remember to limit any gathering and socializing until you are outside in the parking lot.
- Worship services will continue to be recorded and will be available in audio and/or video format to view online.
