# Pastor's Page...

Most folks think that the twelve days of Christmas come before Christmas day but they actually are meant to come following Christmas to the day of Epiphany (always January 6th.) Epiphany is the 3rd season of the liturgical church year following Advent and Christmas. Epiphany is six weeks long. It's color is a dark, rich forest green. Some of the symbols are: the Christmas star, three crowns, 3 Magi.

We think about the Magi visiting the Holy Family when Jesus is about 2 years old to give them the kingly gifts of gold, Frankincense and Myrrh. We don't know how many Magi, Sages, Wise Men there actually were—we sing *We Three Kings*, but that's based on the three gifts. Joseph is warned in a dream to travel to Egypt to save Jesus who will be sought out by Herod the puppet king to be murdered, Herod fearing Jesus' power. The three expensive gifts would make it possible for the Holy Family to be in exile until it would be safe for them to return to Nazareth in Israel following Herod's death.

Julie S. and Pat P. shared this interesting Facebook page with me and I thought it was good to share as we enter the next season of the church year: Epiphany.

#### TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS (Dec. 25-Jan. 6)

The partridge in a pear tree is Jesus Christ.

Two turtle doves are the Old and New Testaments.

Three French hens stand for faith, hope, and love.

The four calling birds are the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

The five golden rings recalled the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament.

The six geese a-laying stand for the six days of creation.

Seven swans a-swimming represent the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit--Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.

The eight maids a-milking are the eight Beatitudes.

Nine ladies dancing are the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit--Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self Control.

The ten lords a-leaping are the Ten Commandments.

The eleven pipers piping stand for the eleven faithful disciples.

The twelve drummers drumming symbolize the twelve points of belief in the Apostles'

Creed.


The Potato Bash is back once again and will be held Sunday, March 17th immediately following church. Your donations for the bash help fund service organizations in Gratiot County.
