Pastor's Page....

This Advent Season we are studying Rev. Susan Robb's book: The Angels of Christmas—Hearing God's Voice in Advent. Rev. Robb writes:

Angels Gather Among Us....

Roberta, a member of my Bible study group, had driven her husband to MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, where he was to receive a lifesaving stem cell transplant. Before the transplant could take place, however, her husband required a very risky surgery. The doctors were honest as they told Roberta and her husband, Tom, that his chances of surviving the surgery were less than 50 percent.

Other than Tom's medical team, Roberta knew no one else in the hospital, and she'd had no conversations with others. Knowing the odds were not in her husband's favor, Roberta sat alone at a table in the waiting room while he was in surgery, laid her head down on the table, and began to sob. After a few minutes, a woman she had never seen before approached and introduced herself. She said she and her mother had recently flown to Houston from Egypt, and her mother was having surgery that day. Then she reached out and touched Roberta's hand and said, "I just came over here to tell you that your husband is going to be okay." Roberta later said that when the woman touched her hand, a complete sense of peace washed over her, and her words and her voice filled Roberta with a deep sense of assurance and comfort.

Hours later, Tom came out of the surgery—alive. He made it through the critical hours of the night and by the next day it was apparent that he would be able to receive his stem cell transplant in the near future. Roberta asked the nursing staff if they would lead her to this woman's mother's room so she could properly thank her for her words that brought her through the ordeal with a sense of peace. However, none of the nurses she spoke with had seen anyone fitting the woman's description, and they insisted that no one from Egypt had been admitted to the hospital.

Later that day, Roberta asked her husband's surgeon if he knew anything about the woman and her mother. The doctor affirmed the medical staff's assessment: "We don't have anyone here from Egypt." He went on to say, "We get stories like this all the time here at MD Anderson. You've just experienced an angel sighting!"

Sometimes angels appear in our lives in such a way and with such an impact that it's difficult to tell if their presence is human or divine. But one thing is certain: whether the angels we experience are of human or divine origin, the Divine is always at work in and through these messengers to offer assurance, guidance, comfort, peace, love, and protection to God's children.

How have you experienced heaven's messages? How have you experienced angel-like helpers in your life? How have you/are you being an angel-like helper to family, 1 friends or strangers? We are blessed to be a blessing. Merry CHRISTmas!



ADVENT - CHRISTMAS NEWS

THEME:

Our 2023 Advent-Christmas theme is: *The Angels of Christmas: Hearing God's Voice in Advent* based on a book and study by Rev. Susan Robb (UMC.) In worship and mid-week study we'll explore the four angelic visits surrounding the birth of Jesus with Zechariah, Mary, Joseph, and the shepherds. We'll look deeper into the angel Gabriel (the Announcer) and other angels in the Old Testament while looking at God's presence in history and our lives today.

DECORATIONS:

Family Tree – Both churches are inviting your family (no matter the size) to bring in an ornament for the tree in Fellowship Hall to represent your family... a **Church Family Tree**. It doesn't have to be fancy or homemade—just what you think represents you. Please bring it to the church <u>BEFORE</u> hanging of the Greens (11/26-SLF, 11/30-B) and put it on the table or cart in the gathering area.

Angels – We are decorating the entire facility with angels... if you have one or more angels we can borrow for several weeks, please \underline{LABEL} and bring to the church \underline{before} the Hanging of the Greens dates. Place on the table or cart in the gathering area.

SHORT-TERM ADULT STUDY WITH SIMPLE SUPPER:

A 4-week adult mid-week study will be offered using the dvd and study that goes with our 2023 heme: *The Angels of Christmas: Hearing God's Voice in Advent* by Rev. Susan Robb (UMC.) We'll explore in-depth the four angelic visits surrounding the birth of Jesus with Zechariah, Mary, Joseph, and the shepherds as well as the angel Gabriel's role and other angels in the Old Testament. We'll rotate our meeting places each week with that church offering a simple supper from 6-6:30pm and then the study from 6:30-8pm. Come for supper or just the study. Supporting our Advent-Christmas theme we will all be encouraged to "be an angel" this season by picking up a paper angel displayed at both churches which will list a small item to be purchased for our shutins, assisted living home friends, and clients of 2 other local nursing homes. Gifts such as socks, slippers, lap blankets, etc. will be listed for men and women. Pick up a paper angel, purchase the item listed, wrap the gift (paper or bag) tape the paper angel onto your gift and return by <u>Sun. Dec. 17th</u>. Ken and Lynne Holloway (and BUMC Outreach Team) are coordinating this project for both churches. **Delivery persons will be needed the week of Dec. 18—23.**
