

# Pastor's Page....

We are entering the longest season of the Christian Year, the Sundays after Pentecost, or what is also called Ordinary Time. For many the days feel ordinary, week after week of the long spring and summer and the early fall season. It is the time when attendance patterns shift, and folks find it hard to maintain a regular weekly presence. Ordinary. Yet, it could be argued that this season is where our faith gets put to the test. From Advent through Pentecost Sunday, we are walking with Jesus, learning, growing, and inviting alongside him; observing and listening as he makes his earthly journey. Then on Pentecost, the church takes the stage and seeks to live out all that has been learned as we show the world what living in the kingdom looks like.

We don't walk alone, however. That is why the first worship series of this lone season of Pentecost is about the God we proclaim. We want to keep a proper perspective as we live out our faith and realize that while our efforts are important, it is by the grace of God that we can be the church we are called to be. Even here, in the season after Pentecost, we ascribe to God all the glory, all the wonder, all the joy that is within us. To help us in that task, we will turn to the songbook of the Bible: the assigned psalms.

Alex Smalley wants everyone to wake up earlier—or perhaps pause more at day's end. Why? To gaze at sunrises and sunsets. Those fleeting moments are the most beautiful, awe-inspiring times of the day, according to Smalley, the lead researcher of a British study on awe-inducing weather effects. A stunning sunrise or sunset can improve mood, increase positive emotions, and decrease stress. Smalley says, "When you see something vast and overwhelming or something that produces this feeling of awe, your own problems can feel diminished and so you don't worry so much about them."

King David beheld God's creation, declaring, "The heavens declare the glory of God: the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge" (PSALM 19: 1-2) As for the sun, "It rises at one end of the heavens and makes its circuit to the other; nothing is deprived of its warmth" (v.6). God's glorious creation reflects the all-powerful Creator. Why not take time today to look to the skies and marvel in God!


Congratulations go out to all our area graduates, but a special congratulations goes out to the graduates of our congregation.
