Do you remember the "plate spinner" variety show guy from the Ed Sullivan show? Yes, I'm aging most of us! We might have been awed at the marvel as the guy ran back and forth keeping all the dozens of plates going. We were amazed! What would happen if he couldn't keep up? The ceramic plates would crash to the floor broken into shards. A *trick* turned into *trash*.

Recently, I spoke with the kids and adults attending the worship service about being aware of how many "plates" all of us are "spinning." I encouraged all of us to be more patient and kind in our expectations and demands of each other. Everyone received a drawing of the "plate spinner" and were encouraged to write on the "plates" all the things we were trying to keep "spinning." Each of us have so many things on our "plates."

As disciples on the path with Jesus, we should be striving to be more loving and kind to everyone we meet, but this is especially so in the church family. We have the whole world out there mistreating each other and "against us." Jesus gives us, in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke (Mt. 18: 15-17, Lk. 17:3) instructions on how to talk with, and to, each other if there is a disagreement between disciples. Maybe you have heard me say, "Agree to disagree in the love of Christ." The grace of God which is extended to each of us over and over must be extended to all our brothers and sisters especially in the church family.

We should be examples of Jesus as His disciples. When we choose (and it is a choice) to not act towards each other with patience, kindness and God's grace, we are a stumbling block to others and our hypocrisy hurts the possibility of strengthening another's spiritual journey or maybe even turning them completely away from God. People of all ages, backgrounds and experiences are looking to us, and listening to us, to see if we will really be salt and light, and treat each other the way Jesus instructs us. The Golden Rule: "Treat others as you want them to treat you" (Mt. 7:12 CEV) is only "golden" if we live it out as Christ's disciples. We can do this, if we choose to, if we want to.

Let's continue on our path of discipleship, growing together, not apart. As we care for our own "plates" spinning, let's help each other to keep their "plates" going. We wouldn't want our plates or each other's to come crashing down to become broken shards of trash. You are valuable and so are our brothers and sisters in Christ. Let's live like it!
